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Why Are the Metrics Different For The Public Sector?

The average person may use social media for information or to gain a level of notoriety. For public sector entities, social media should be purpose driven. As a representative for the agencies, school districts, and law enforcement precincts that use social media, the metrics you care about most are different from the average user. Impressions on Twitter and Instagram mean more than likes. Reaching your local constituents on Facebook means more than total follower count. Your community members rely on supported social media to learn accurate information about sponsored

events, breaking news, and civic engagement opportunities. So analyzing the numbers that help you meet those needs will give your social media the greatest impact.

Why does engagement matter?

In the interest of preventing controversy, many agencies try to limit engagement and only use social media as a form of one-way communication. This strategy not only reduces the spread of the posts and possible impressions, but it also limits your agency's ability to build trust with your community and control your story if challenges ever arise. Liking posts, asking questions, and addressing concerns help your agency define itself as a reliable resource.

Facebook

Facebook is the social network where you can share your most important events and receive direct feedback from your community. Build trust among your followers by addressing questions and engaging in discussions that ensure an accurate and positive narrative for your agency and district.

Equations To Know

Average Impressions

= Lifetime Post Total Reach/ Total Number of posts

Percentage of Followers Who Saw Our Post

= Average Impressions/ Number of Followers

Average Number of Engagements Per Post

= Total Number of Engagements/ Total Number of Posts

Average Engagement Rate Per Follower

 Average Number of Engagements Per Post/ Number of Followers (Multiply by 100 to get the percentage)

Twitter

Twitter is an opportunity to quickly share information with a variety of audiences, including those outside your direct community. Your goals for each tweet can range from building awareness around an upcoming event to managing communication in an emergency.

Equations To Know

Average Impressions Per Follower

= Average Impressions/ Number of Followers

Average Number of Engagements Per Post = Average Engagements / Number of Posts

Average Engagement Rate Per Follower = Average engagement / Number of Followers

How To Download

Your agency should be using an Instagram Professional account to get the best analytics available. The easist way to find these data points is looking at each post on the application.

The JSON Files

If you feel comfortable transitioning between different file types, Instagram will let you request to download your metrics through JSON files separated by content type.

Equations To Know

Reach Rate

=Number of People Who Have Seen Post/Number of Followers

Engagement on Reach

=Total of Likes, Comments, and Saves for a Post/ Posts' Reach

Average Saves

=Number of Saves/Number of Posts Over Time

YouTube

Want to give more information than a tweet and better quality than facebook live? YouTube is where you can take your time to create quality videos for people that may want to know about the what, why, and how behind the work that goes on behind the screen.



Measuring the Greatest Success

Success on social media does not come overnight. The very definition of success may be different for each district, agency, or office depending on your specific community. Instead of trying to get the highest number on all of your metrics, focus on the outcomes you wish to see in your community. Let those outcomes be the guide for your social media strategy. For example:

Low turnout rate at local events?

Build your Reach! Post shareable teasers about the event on Facebook and Twitter to build excitement, and consider using Instagram Live to showcase real-time action. Don't forget to use a memorable event hashtag!

Poor public relations?

Focus on engagement rates! Ask questions, create polls, share the best content you have to offer. Most importantly, make it a conversation and respond thoughtfully to your constituents.

Whether you represent a school district, law enforcement agency, or municipality, your social media has the power to truly improve the lives of your community members. Focusing on the metrics that best support your social media strategy will decrease your effort and increase your impact.

How can you save your records?
